November 29, 2009 • First Sunday of Advent

Working with the Scriptures (*Luke 21:25-28, 34-36*)

"Happy New Year!" This greeting is often accompanied by questions like, "What are you doing to celebrate?" or "Are you going to any parties?" At least, those are the questions we're usually asked when the person wishing us a Happy New Year is talking about January 1. So why are we bringing it up today? Because, liturgically speaking, the First Sunday of Advent (Nov. 29 this year) is the Church's New Year's Day. But, then, if this is the Church's New Year's Day why does the Gospel focus on "dismay" and "fright" instead of on celebration? That certainly doesn't sound like any way to begin a New Year! Well, perhaps we should try reversing things. Perhaps Luke is telling us that before we can celebrate we must first overcome dismay and fright.

"I feel like a new man." "It's like I have a new lease on life." You might expect to hear this from someone who has found the support of a 12-step group or been welcomed into a warming shelter, or from someone who has realized the dream of owning his or her own home through the generosity of Habitat for Humanity. But listen again. It's actually the person who *works* at the shelter who is speaking. And it's the person who *works* for Habitat for Humanity who has found a new lease on life.

Luke describes the signs that will precede the coming of the Son of Man. Well, we certainly don't have to look far to find tribulations. Just read the newspaper! So when will the Son of Man come? How about *right now*? Every time we receive Eucharist and say "Amen" - "Yes, I believe" that I must become what I eat, the Body of Christ - the Son of Man is present. But we have to be "awake" when we say that "Amen." We don't have to work in a shelter or for Habitat for Humanity; we only have to be "vigilant" for opportunities to make Christ present - in our homes and in our workplaces - *right where we are*. The problem? First we have to wake up. Happy New Year!
