My father, Wilfred Rivard, was a special man. Dad was born on April 8, 1913 in Somerset, WI and he passed away on March 10, 1980 in Rice Lake, WI. Dad had to quit school after 8th grade in order to help support his family. He started working at a cheese factory at that time. He was a cheese maker for years and later owned a dairy where he processed milk, made ice cream and sold over 80 types of cheese both domestic and imported. Connected to the dairy was a restaurant where all of us seven children worked.

Dad was a 4th degree Knight of Columbus, a member of the Holy Name Society and also a member of the Elks and Moose organizations. Dad loved to read especially adventure books. He was a good husband to Eileen Parent and was married to her for forty some years. They said the Rosary every night together before going to bed.

In the summer Dad often took us to nearby lakes to swim or fish. On Sunday afternoons we went for a ride and stopped at a rural school house to play on the swings and seesaw. He packed us a picnic lunch for us to enjoy. He made the Sunday dinner each Sunday to give my mother a rest. He was a good cook. In the winter he taught us how to ski, ice skate, toboggan and sled downhill.
