

Br. Ray's Reflections

We mark the end of our Church year this weekend as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This King is not your typical ruler. Although he speaks with authority, he is never authoritarian. Although he is all powerful, he would rather take the place of the powerless. Although he is God made man, he empties himself of his Divinity taking the form of a slave. No, this King is very different. Beyond our wildest imaginings, he is the king who has fallen completely and utterly in love with his subjects. He never uses his power to oppress or humiliate anyone but uses that power to kneel before us and wash our feet. He uses his power to show us the most tender love. He is the Good Shepherd who tirelessly runs after us when we stray and, when he finds us, he doesn't scold us but carries us all the way home with an unconditional embrace. Even when we raised him high on the cross and he felt the pain of all suffering and sin and utter abandonment, he didn't condemn us but said, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing." Yes, this King doesn't fit the mold of most kings throughout history. This king uses his power to free us, empower us, and carry us through the most difficult moments of our lives. This is Christ the King. The greatest reverence we can give this King is to follow him in his compassion.

"I was hungry, and you fed me, thirsty, and you gave me a drink, naked, and you clothed me, a prisoner, and you visited me, a stranger, and you welcomed me..."

We are called to build the Kingdom of God and Christ, our King, has shown us the way.




