

# Br. Ray's Reflections

In our Gospel today, Jesus comes from the temptations in the desert and begins to preach to the people of Galilee. His call is:

"This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Repentance is another one of those Lenten words that is hard to take. None of us want to look at our mistakes, our regrets in life, our failures, our sin and, ultimately, our broken parts. It's too hard to go there and so we use all types of strategies to keep us from looking at our dark side. Our strategies may include watching mindless TV, eating too much, drinking too much, watching pornography, keeping busy all the time, constantly on our phones, always being the helper so we don't have to recognize our own needs, and all the ways we cover up the parts of our hurting selves. All the stuff of Lent (fasting and abstinence, more time in prayer, daily Mass, Stations of the cross, devotions of all kinds, soup suppers, etc.) are not ends in themselves but are there to move us closer to facing our need for the unconditional love of God. When people with addictions decide they have to change, it's usually because they have hit rock bottom. They realize that they can no longer live the way they've been living, and they decide to take a new path. They decide to turn away from their addictions and old lifestyle and take steps that will lead them to a new life. We may not hit rock bottom this lent but we are called to be vulnerable and allow God to see our wounds. It may be wounds from childhood that we have carried, or expectations of perfection that have been hurled on us from someone in authority, or grief that we have never dealt with or a trauma that we have covered up or the pains of a chronic disability or aging or the struggles with our children and grandchildren. If we choose just one part of our life to deal with this Lent, Christ will be there to greet us and love us beyond our imaginings. Let's have the courage to be vulnerable this Lent.

As part of my own need for healing, I will have the church open each morning during Lent, Monday through Friday, from 8 am -9 am for silent meditation before the Blessed Sacrament. Come as you are and find a quiet space for yourself. There will be no words...just quiet. I would recommend not bringing a lot of prayers or reading materials but just come...you and Christ quietly sitting together. Let's see what happens.

These opportunities are **in addition** to the standard need based grant and tuition assistance (FACTS) program through St. Francis Xavier Catholic School System.

#### St. Joseph Parish Tuition Scholarship

What? St. Joseph "Tuition Scholarship" Program. Three scholarships of \$2,500 are available to parishioners of St. Joseph who are currently enrolled or considering enrollment in the St. Francis Xavier School System.
Who is eligible? Students/families of Xavier *Elementary, Middle or High School* who are registered parishioners of St. Joseph Parish.

#### St. Mary School/Catholic Central Legacy Scholarship

To carry on the 150 year tradition of generosity and fraternity associated with our school community, this scholarship has been established to help support young families in their decision to send their child(ren) to Xavier Elementary (PK3-4<sup>th</sup> grade) schools.

What? Three scholarships of \$2,000 each will be awarded to families with \$1,000 being awarded the first year and \$500 in years two and three.
Who is eligible? Active members of St. Joseph, St. Bernard or St. Mary Parishes with students registered at *Xavier Elementary Schools.*
