Br. Ray's Reflections

Our first reading today speaks of poor Job. He had it all and then watched it get taken away from him and his family. His story grapples with the questions of why good people have to suffer. How many of us have asked that question when someone we know who is so good goes through terrible ordeals in life. Why do innocent people have to suffer? These haunting questions arise when we see the suffering children in Gaza, Israel, Ukraine and so many parts of the world. It just becomes overwhelming and we have no easy answers. Maybe that vulnerability is the answer. Suffering knocks us off our pedestals of self-reliance, independence and surety and reminds us that we are not in control. We don't understand the mystery of God or even the mystery of our own lives. Suffering can move us in different directions. We can spend our days with our fists raised to God and the world. This is a very understandable posture for those who have suffered more than their share. The problem is when we allow suffering to win and we remain bitter, then we can miss the tremendous moments of grace in our lives. We will miss the joy and laughter of our children, the love of our spouse and the outpouring of goodness from many of our friends. Job wrestled with his suffering and fought with God a bit but then remembered the Psalm we will sing today, "Praise the Lord, who heals the brokenhearted." Even though he couldn't understand the mystery of his suffering, he still held on to hope in the God who would ultimately save him. Whatever we may be going through these days, maybe we can remind ourselves that this is not the end of the story. Suffering and all kinds of evil will not have the last word. The one who heals the brokenhearted will always be true to his word! So, let's keep walking until we see the sunrise.

On a completely different note, we begin the Bishop's Appeal this weekend. This is our yearly collection for the good works of the Diocese. The Diocese uses these monies to assist Catholic Charities in their outreach programs and runs formation programs for our leaders in liturgy and Religious Education. A few parishioners have shared the fact that the Diocese was a huge support when St. Joe's was going through transition. They brought in Fr. Raja when the Capuchins had no one to send. Bishop Ricken kept St. Joe's opened with the hope that there would be a Capuchin to lead the parish again. It was really important for him to find a Capuchin for St. Joe's. He and the Diocese were there for us when we needed them the most. We may want to give in a spirit of gratitude this year for all that St. Joe's has been given. Our goal is a bit less than last year; it is \$88,667. You know how much I hate asking for money, but if we can raise this quickly, we don't have to think about it until next year. (Just a note that the parish will have to take monies from our operating funds if we don't make our goal.) Thanks again for all your generosity and kindness!
