

# Br. Ray's Reflections

I like the Second reading from Ephesians this week:

"Brothers and Sisters:
You were once darkness,
But now you are light in the Lord.
Live as children of the light,
For light produces every kind of goodness
And righteousness and truth.
Take no part in the fruitless works of darkness;
Therefore, it says,
"Awake O sleeper,
And arise from the dead,
And Christ will give you light."

In our world these days, there is a darkness of hatred, violence, war and just our inhumanity to one another. People can be killed for the most senseless things. We live in a culture that often says directly or indirectly that we must take care of ourselves, and although we may feel bad for those who are vulnerable, there is little we can do. It is that attitude that makes many apathetic to the needs around us. It is when good people become complacent with darkness that darkness can take over. Dr. Martin Luther King is quoted as saying, "the only necessary thing for the triumph of evil is for good (men) to do nothing." As Paul says, we are children of the light. We are called to bring light to our world in the way we live our lives. We are called to go the extra mile for someone who needs us, to be patient with the people who upset us, to keep trying to forgive those who hurt us and continue to find new ways to give our life away to those who need some light in their lives. If we water down our call to just being nice people, we will not be able to light up the darkness. We are called to be ambassadors for the Light of Christ. This is a call to be heroic, courageous and brave. Let's fill our world with light this next week by our attitude of kindness, our hearts that are generous and our minds that look for solutions to the divisions among us.
