

REACHING IN, REACHING OUT, REACHING GOD

Br. Ray's Reflections

Here we are on Palm Sunday and we begin the procession through the holiest weeks in our Church year. Today we shout, "Hosanna in the highest" as we process with our palm branches but in the same Mass we will hear the Passion and witness the jeers of the crowd as they cry out: "Crucify him, Crucify him!" It's a jarring week filled with suffering, betrayal, denials and the broken heart of a mother. It might be a good meditation to see where we are in the stories this week. Are we like Peter paralyzed by fear and unable to stand up for what is right? Are we like the other disciples who run away from the uncomfortable or dangerous situations in our life? Are we like Mary who stands faithfully with her son through all his suffering even though it breaks her heart? Are we like John, the Beloved disciple, who refuses to run away from his friend in the hardest days of his life? Are we like Simon who helps Christ to carry the cross as we help those whose crosses are too heavy for one person to bear? Are we like Christ who falls three times on his way to Calvary but refuses to give up and continues despite the pain? Are we like Veronica who wipes the face of Jesus and shows a tender compassion to her suffering friend?

The story of the Passion shows the best in us and the worst in us. It reminds us that we've been most or all the characters in this story at some point in our life. The good news is that in the end we are all the "good thief," crying out to Christ, "Remember me, when you come into your Kingdom!" And we, like the good thief hear those reassuring words, "This day you will be with me in Paradise!" This week we will hear the story of our salvation and we can rejoice because we have been saved by Christ who has laid down his life for us out of the most wondrous love.

"What wondrous love is this that caused the Lord of bliss to bear the dreadful curse for my soul, for my soul..."


