Br. Ray's Reflections

We are already at the Third Sunday of Lent! Didn't we just get ashes? We will be at the halfway mark to Easter next week! So how are you doing with your Lenten promises? Have you prayed more? Have you been good about those chocolates you gave up? Have you been kinder and more generous with other people? If we've slipped on our promises, we still have time! For the next three weeks we will participate in scrutinies with Emiliano Victoria at the 10am Mass. Emiliano is our "elect" member who will be receiving the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. During this sacred time before entering the church, Emiliano will scrutinize his life and look at those areas where he needs to grow in his faith and in his love for Christ. Each Sunday, he will be prayed over and challenged to look at areas of blindness, areas where he lacks compassion, and areas where he is broken and needs God's tender mercy. It's wonderful that Emiliano goes through these scrutinies, but we are all called to scrutinize our lives, as well. Although we have all gone through the waters of baptism, we have all slipped and have lost our way at times. During this season as we walk with Emiliano, we all walk with Christ, too. We sit with Christ at the well and have a conversation with him just like the Samaritan woman. We ask for clearer sight and a new vision of ourselves and our world like the blind man. We pray that we do not get stuck in tombs of fear and complacency, but we hear the voice of Christ calling us to new life as he did for his friend, Lazarus. Yes, we gather around our brother, Emiliano, during these next weeks rooting him on in the faith but it would be a great loss if we didn't look at our relationship with Christ, too. The Lord calls all of us to something different this year. We are called to be better people than we were last year. Let's hear the call this year in a deeper way and become those people God created us to be. It's a tough walk but it leads to greater peace and a deeper joy. Let's keep walking together in these last weeks and allow Christ to work on our hearts. Happy Third Sunday of Lent!!


Lenten Habitat Collection


