

Marriage: Active parish membership of 6 months is required before a wedding date may be set.


Reconciliation: Saturdays from 9 until approximately 9:30 am or call for an appointment.

Father Gerry's "CAP"-TIONS



Memorial Day is Monday, May 30th. A National Holiday remembering our Military Service men and women who have died for the preservation of our freedom and peace as a nation. The Catholic Bishops Conference invites us to keep before us this 'Prayer for Memorial Day':

God of power and mercy,
you destroy war and put down earthly pride.
Banish violence from our midst and wipe away
our tears, that we may all deserve to be called
your sons and daughters.

Keep in your mercy those men and women
who have died in the cause of freedom
and bring them safely into your kingdom
of justice and peace.

We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Pope Francis reminds and exhorts us to be peacemakers: "Bringing peace is central to the mission of Christ's disciples. That peace is offered to all those men and women who long for peace amid the tragedies and violence that mark human history. The "Peace be to this house" (Lk 10:5-6) of which Jesus speaks is every family, community, country and continent, in all their diversity and history. It is first and foremost each individual person, without distinction or discrimination. But it is also our "common home"; the world in which God has placed us and which we are called to care for and cultivate."

"Politics is an essential means of building human community and institutions, but when political life is not seen as a form of service to society as a whole, it can become a means of oppression, marginalization and even destruction."

"I pray for an end to wars, conflicts and the great suffering caused by human agency. I pray especially that, on the basis of our common calling to cooperate with God and all people of good will for the advancement of harmony and peace in the world, we may resist the temptation to act in a manner unworthy of our humanity."


